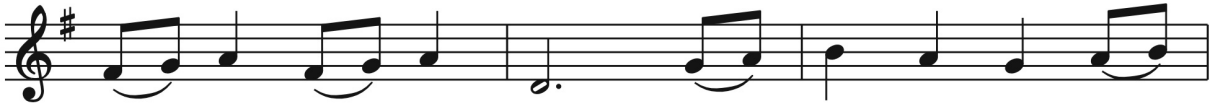

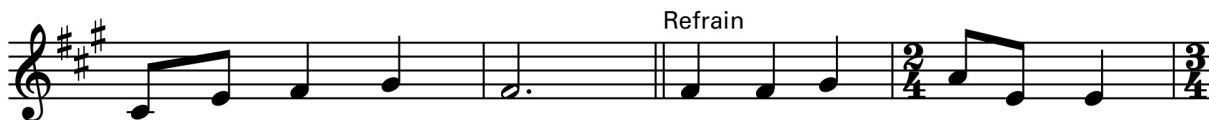

Intercessor People Awaken us to our responsibility for the care of creation;
Shower your blessing on earth, O God.

Intercessor People Forgive us our waste and pollution of creation and strengthen us to heal wounds we have inflicted;
Shower your blessing on earth, O God.

Intercessor People Remember all in captivity and those who are hunted, trapped, deserted, or abused, that they may find safety in homes of loving care;
Shower your blessing on earth, O God.

Intercessor People Do not forget those animals who have died yet remain dear to us, that they may rejoice in your new creation;
Shower your blessing on earth, O God.
